My precious Breezy born on Dec 26, 2000. Although the first 2 years of her life she was shuffled around to 5 other homes, God meant for her to be with me. On January 19th of 2003 I adopted her and from that moment on we were just about inseparable. She followed me everywhere, she sat out side the shower waiting for me. She was at my feet when I used the bathroom. When we left the dog park she always had her nose on my butt, at the cabin she cried when I wasn't within eye sight. When I work downstairs and she was outside, she was at the window so she could see me. So many others had let her down and it showed, she had a huge fear of being abandoned. So I gave her lots of attention and the more I brushed her, scratched, and massaged the more she loved me. We filled a void in each others lives that she needed and that I cherished so much. She protected me, and I felt safe, she loved me and I felt loved, she followed me and I felt needed. There will never be another Breezy. She was the sweetest dog that I have ever met.

On November 14th I brought her to the vet to check out her swelled glands, thinking an antibiotic would clear that right up. To my surprise she was diagnosed with lymphoma, cancer of the glands. She lived well for 2 half months, and then got very ill on her last night. I wanted to hug her so bad but she was in pain. I wanted her to press her head against mine like she always did as if to say "I love you". I wanted her to give me one more of her funny little kisses, but she couldn't do it. On February 3rd Emily, Holly, Marie, Breezy, and I were all in my van with George Winston playing (my sad music) and the vet came out to the van. She was surrounded by the people who loved her the most, and I held her head in my lap so that I was the last person she saw. She is buried at the cabin over looking the lake next to Lewis, Gus, and Willy. I had her just over 7 years, she was 9 years old.




### RUBY
